Developed through design-based research methodology, drawing on 1,000+ hours of curriculum design across 15 institutions, the framework synthesises insights from established learning theories (Freire, Kolb, UDL) whilst introducing novel integration approaches. Key innovations include embedded values within each quadrant, explicit neurodiversity affirmation, and assumption of human-AI collaboration.

The framework offers practical implementation pathways for curriculum designers, qualification bodies, and workplace learning professionals. Unlike existing competency models that list discrete skills, the Compass provides both theoretical coherence and actionable tools for holistic learner development.

This paper presents the complete framework, its theoretical foundations, implementation guidance, and implications for educational transformation. By reconceptualising learning as navigation rather than accumulation, the Holistic Learning Compass offers a timely response to education's contemporary crisis whilst maintaining focus on human flourishing in an uncertain future.
